If the water stain cannot be removed with amalgamator you need to use the softest steel wool to rub it. Make sure you do it gently. If this does not work, then you need to use 600-grit sandpaper. You can damp the sandpaper in some soapy water, which will act as a lubricant. Rubbing the stained surface with the sandpaper should work.

It is fairly easy to fix scratches and nicks on wooden surfaces. You need to use an appropriate stain for the purpose. You are highly recommended to get pigmented oil stain for best results. The first step you have to perform is to clean the wooden surface carefully to remove any dust or spots. Then you need to apply the stain using a soft cloth. Make sure to cover the entire scratched surface. After applying the stain, take another clean cloth and wipe the excess immediately. Then allow the surface to dry, preferably for 24 hours. The final step is to apply new finish using a cloth.

In some cases, only the original style and design are replicated. New materials, tools and techniques can be used for the making of the pieces. This makes them cheaper, but if the wood and other materials are of high quality, then you can expect the items to have a higher intrinsic value, even though their value as art objects will be significantly lower.

Generally, the value of antique reproduction pieces is lower than the one of originals. However, there are exceptions to this rule that you should be aware of. As said earlier, if the reproduction item is unique, made from aged materials and of high quality, then it can actually be more valuable then an original antique piece, which does not have these attributes.

The value of a piece of antique furniture is determined by its age, provenance, rarity, quality and condition. This makes it possible for a replica to acquire an antique value at one point in time. For instance, a reproduction of a 17th century piece made in the early 1900's can actually be considered an antique. Its value will be even higher, if the item is custom made, as this makes it extremely rare. If this old reproduction furniture piece is of excellent quality and in good condition, then it will be even more valuable and more expensive on the market than the original.

It is true that antique replica furniture pieces do not have the same significance to collectors and dealers. However, just like in the example above, they can have or acquire high non-intrinsic value. More importantly, these pieces can add the required antique style to your décor and elegance to your home, without you spending a fortune.

10. Important Characteristics of Antique Oriental Furniture

The Orient has always been and still is extremely exotic for Westerners. We marvel at the art pieces from the Far East not only because of their unique designs, beauty and elegance; the forms used in this part of the world as well as the decorative arts techniques vary dramatically from what we are familiar with. Hence, you should expect to come across a lot of surprises when looking for antique Oriental furniture.

The culture in the Far East differs dramatically from the culture in the Western world. This creates dramatic differences in the lifestyle as well as in home décor and the furniture used. The antique Oriental furniture pieces are extremely simplistic, especially compared to the elaborately designed items from countries such as France and Germany. The decorative motifs are basic and can even be described as crude. In many cases, they are missing completely. The Oriental furniture pieces are designed to bring functionality and uniformity to the décor. Their purpose is to bring harmony from the natural world into the house.

Despite their simple designs and geometric forms, the antique Oriental furniture pieces can boast originality, beautiful colors and stylish ornamentations. In addition, various lacquering techniques come from the Far East. These methods gave elegance and a refined look to the pieces.

The most notable antique Oriental furniture pieces come from China and Japan. The different styles which emerged in these countries remained in use for centuries due to the traditional practices of Asian artists, designers and craftsmen. Unlike the dramatic changes of styles that took place in Europe and America, the traditions in Oriental furniture making were preserved, even though practical improvements to the designs were introduced throughout the different periods.

The Chinese homes were modestly furnished. In many cases, one piece of furniture served a dual purpose. For instance, the Ta beds and Luohanchuang beds were used both as beds and benches and sofas for sitting.

Plain geometric designs were typical for the chairs and stools. The traditional Chinese Dengzi stools are low and have a plain square form. The Zuodun tools have unique barrel shapes and more artistic designs. They resemble exotic drums. Most antique Chinese chairs have square seats. The back is made by three vertical wood panels with the central one being wider and the two side ones being extremely thin. The three pieces attached to a horizontal top panel. The legs are straight and relatively short. They have little or no ornamentation.

Antique Chinese tables have rectangular or square tops and legs. Tables of different sizes and heights served different purposes. The larger ones were used for dining. The ones with drawers served as desks and the small and tall ones were used as stands for plants and decorative objects.

Most antique cabinets coming from China have rectangular shapes and rectilinear lines. Drawers are not typical. You can usually find only shelves behind the two doors of a cabinet. Most models lack any kind of decoration and ornamentation.

The dramatic colors are typical for antique Chinese furniture. Red and black are the most common shades, even though green and brown are popular as well. The wood was highly polished and has a gorgeous shine. Various lacquer techniques were used to give furniture pieces durability and beauty.

The geometric forms and rectilinear shapes are typical for Japanese antique furniture as well. Different types of woods, such as cedar and Japanese elm were used for the making of tables and cabinets. The chairs were not common in traditional Japanese décor. Just like in China, the wood was polished to get the most perfect gloss. The soft and natural red colors are the most common for Japanese furniture. The shades vary from dramatic fire red to paler orange. The ornamentations are not typical for traditional Japanese furniture, even though some items from the 19th century, influenced by Western styles, have beautiful gilded metal appliqués with simple floral patterns.

The traditional Japanese cabinets, known as tansu or dansu, are the most popular pieces of antique Oriental furniture from this region. They have various distinctive designs, typical for the different periods of the country's history. The most impressive kind is Kaidan-Dansu – a cabinet with a staircase shape. It actually served both its furniture and architectural purpose.

11. The Differences in Antique Italian Furniture

It is not a mistake to say that Italy is one of the cradles of civilization. The magnificence of the Roman Empire is still preserved in many of its towns and cities. Italy was the center of Renaissance art, the masterpieces of which are preserved to this day. Thanks to various factors the culture and arts in this region continued to flourish. These are just some of the main factors that explain the large interest in antique Italian furniture. It is perfectly natural for anyone to want to take a piece of history and admire it in their own home.

The periods in Italian furniture making and the changes in style followed closely the pattern typical for the rest of Western Europe. Before the 15th century revival of classicism, the furniture was plain and lacked the complex ornamentations typical of later periods. However, the Italian craftsmen were known for producing excellent pieces in terms of quality.

With the beginning of Italian Renaissance in the 15th century, furniture making underwent a revolution. Interest in the classical period of antiquity and, more precisely in Greek and Roman art, started influencing Italian art. The artists became more interested in the different natural forms and their intrinsic beauty. Furniture designs were inspired by Roman thrones and royal chairs, tables and cabinets. As a result, the pieces made by craftsmen became larger, cozier and much more majestic. The ornamentations were influenced by the traditional decorative motifs found in Roman sculpture and architecture. The sharp and complex ornaments of Gothic art, gave way to natural and more artistic ones, such as animals, shells, vases and scrolls.

In the beginning of the 16th century, Italian furniture designs became more influenced by the grotesque and fantasy forms. The pieces became more elegant, while the ornamentations were inspired by Gothic, Arabic and Oriental art. These new trends were streamed by Mannerism, an artistic style inspired by the works of Michelangelo. The ornamentations in exaggerated natural and human forms became the norm. The use of expressive color combinations was also characteristic.

In the 17th century Italian furniture designs were influenced by **Baroque*** and Rococo, even though the latter style did not become hugely popular it had in other parts of Europe. The furniture pieces regained their massiveness, but this time they became much more comfortable.

The comfort of the user had a major influence on design. Curved and irregular forms were the norm. Ornamentation remained influenced by Mannerism, but the decorative motifs became more and more complex. The shell, floral and animal ornament forms remained popular, but other natural elements, like the sun, were used as well. The principle of asymmetry was widely applied to the design of the decorations of the pieces of furniture.

Italian furniture makers were influenced by the Neoclassicism and Empire styles in the 18th century. The Neoclassical pieces of furniture were once again inspired by the decorative art of ancient Greece and Rome. The designs became less complex. The curved forms were replaced by plainer geometrical ones. The bright colors, typical for Mannerism and Baroque, were replaced by more natural and somewhat paler ones. The ornamentations became flatter. The Roman decorative motifs, such as vases, urns, busts, wreaths and ribbons, regained their popularity.

Empire is usually described as the second phase of Neoclassicism. The furniture designs became more geometric and plainer, but this was not the case with the ornamentations. They became larger and were influenced by Egyptian as well as by Roman and Greek art.

The 19th century in Italy saw the revival of many styles from Gothic and Renaissance to Rococo, which influenced the designs of furniture. Inspiration was drawn from ancient art as well as from Oriental art. As a result, the inlaying with ivory became increasingly popular. Ebony was also widely used along with traditional walnut, from which Italian furniture was made.

At present, collectors can find various antique Italian furniture items. The items from the 18th and 19th century are the most abundant on the market, but it is also possible for you to find well preserved 17th century pieces. Look for pieces from Venice, Florence and the Milan and Veneto regions, which were (and still are) the centers of Italian furniture making.

12. Notable Styles of Antique French Furniture

France can boast a long and interesting art history. The decorative arts and furniture making, in particular, were influenced by the widely spread styles in the rest of Europe, but they were always given distinctive characteristics by the French artists, designers and craftsmen. Due to the political rule in France, most of the antique French furniture styles reflect the preferences and views of its rulers.

In the middle ages, the French furniture was large and crude, just like everywhere else in Europe. The designs were heavily influenced by the Gothic style from the 13th to the 15th century.

The designs became more elegant, but preserved their straight geometrical forms. The decorative motifs became more ornamental and asymmetrical. The floral and animalistic decorative patterns became popular.

The 15th and 16th century Renaissance demanded the transformation of the plain furniture pieces into works of art. The furniture pieces became larger and started having greater practical value. The carvings remained the main form of ornamentation. However, the decorative motifs changed dramatically. They were influenced by ancient Roman and Greek art as well as by mythology. The mythological nymphs and satires were surrounded by leave and vine garlands. Given the great influence by Italian artists, the colors became more pastel. The forms were more exaggerated and somewhat more complex. The craftsmen started making more careful selection of woods. Their preferred materials were oak, walnut and ebony.

The Louis XIV style influenced French furniture designs during most of the 17th century. The Sun King demanded opulence from all decorative art pieces that characterized his rule. The pieces of furniture became extremely gaudy. The ornamentation was rich and complex, with the main decorative motif being the sun, in various forms. A lot of innovations, such as the commode and the bureau plat, emerged during this period.

The Regence style reached its peak in the first two decades of the 18th century. The symmetry in design remained, but the forms gained fluidity. The veneer of precious wood with geometric designs became extremely popular during this period. The guilt bronze decoration typical for Luis XIV style became more abundantly used. The classic and exotic floral decorative motifs became more stylized.

Louis XV style ruled during the rest of the 18th century. The era was extremely productive and creativity became the norm. The curved lines and the asymmetric forms, typical for Rococo, are the most notable characteristics of antique French furniture from this period. The furniture items became more elegant and somewhat feminine. The decorative motifs - flowers, leaves, animal and human faces were extremely gentle. Gold became the most popular paint color. New lacquer techniques were introduced during this period.

The Directoire style influenced the furniture design in the beginning of the 19th century. This style is known for its simplicity, dictated by the French Revolution. The forms became geometric and the liens became rectilinear. The ornamentations were more simplistic, but they preserved their typical floral, foliage and wreath patterns.

The Directoire style is considered to be a transition to Empire, introduced during the rule of Napoleon I. The furniture from the Empire period is characterized by its geometric forms and sharper lines. It was heavily influenced by ancient Roman, Green and Egyptian decorative art. The symmetry was reintroduced. The surfaces became flat and uniform. The gilded bronze appliqués were heavily used. The decorative ornaments were incorporated into the legs and arms of furniture pieces. The decorative motifs took the forms of exotic animals, mythological creatures, sculptures, antique pillars and swans. The use of mahogany for furniture making was abundant during this period.

The beginning of the 19th century was marked by the Restoration and Louis Philippe styles, but apart from bringing back the use of lighter wood and the more curvilinear forms, they did not change French furniture design dramatically. Napoleon III furniture is characterized by darker finishes, natural colors and elegance.

Art Nouveau brought revolution into French furniture designs at the end of the 19th and at the beginning of the 20th century. The natural forms became extremely influential. The fantasy of the designer became the main source of ideas for the design of the pieces. The furniture became more artistic. Art Deco appeared in the 1920's as an opposition to Art Nouveau. The antique French furniture of this style is characterized by straight forms and geometrical shapes.

13. Finding the Right Antique Furniture Dealer

You want a beautiful piece of antique furniture? The easiest way to find what you are looking for is to find an antique furniture dealer that can sell it to you. You should keep in mind that buying such an item is not like going to a regular furniture store and picking the model you like best. There are different places to shop from. The different dealers offer different services. In addition, buying antique furniture requires some research and thorough inspection.

Antique dealers are people or companies that deal with the buying and selling of antiques. They usually do not keep them as their main purpose is to trade for profit. If you own an antique furniture piece that you want to sell and go to a dealer, they will offer you approximately 50% less than what they can sell it for. Hence, you can always expect to pay more than the actual value of the object. This is perfectly normal, but in some cases the dealer can be unethical and can attempt to rob you of your money. That is why you should be careful when looking for an antique dealer.

You should definitely ask around to find out more about the reputation of different local dealers. You can do a more comprehensive research and talk to some of their past or present clients. It is perfectly possible for you to find antique dealers online and buy pieces from them as well. All the same tips for finding the best ones are applicable. In addition, you have to perform a more thorough research on the dealer since you will not meet them or their representative. If you shop from the online store of an established and reputable dealer, you will have some guarantee for the item you are buying. The popular auction sites offer relatively good protection as well. However, it is not impossible for you to come across scammers, so it is always a good idea to be more cautious when shopping for antiques online.

14. Antique Furniture Shops Overview

You have decided that you want to own and probably trade with antique furniture. The best places to head for are the antique furniture shops. There you should be able to find great pieces that can add opulence and beauty to your home and that can perhaps be resold for a great profit.

The first question that needs to be answered is where you can find antique furniture shops. There are ones present in almost every town. If you live in a small place, you might want to go to the nearest large city. There you will find a wide range of antique furniture shops, with some of them even specializing in selling items from different styles, periods or countries. It is a good idea to check out the yellow pages first to get the exact addresses of the shops.

It is quite possible to shop for antique furniture online as well. There are various dealers that have websites on the internet. The auction sites are definitely great places to shop from. There you can find plenty of great antique furniture pieces at a bargain.

Before you decide to use the services of an antique furniture shop, you have to learn more about the seller. It is essential for them to have excellent reputation among collectors and dealers. It is worth spending some time asking around. Also do some research on past sales and clients. After all, you have to have some kind of guarantee that you will not fall into the trap of scammers.

Once you find the right antique furniture shops, you have to decide on what to buy. It is always a good idea to set a budget, especially if you plan to resell the piece or pieces you purchase. Generally, you have to decide whether you want to form a collection of antique furniture or just buy different pieces. This will give you an idea of what to look for when shopping. When making your inspection, you should look for any damage as well. It is a good idea to lift the piece gently, if possible, to make sure that any parts will not fall off. You might want to check the stability of the item as well.

It is definitely a good idea to ask for a discount when buying antique furniture. Most shops are ready to offer one, so you should not miss this opportunity. If you use some basic bargaining tricks, you can reduce the price by up to 30%.

When buying items from antique furniture shops, you should always ask for receipt. Apart from the price and title of the item, the receipt should state its wood type, style, age and any distinct marks it might have. Any damages or restoration done on the piece should be mentioned as well. Get information on the shop's return policy, just to be on the safe side.

15. How to Have Your Own Antique Furniture Valued

Buying and selling antiques can be extremely lucrative. In some cases, you can get more than two or three times the original price for an antique furniture piece. The problem most owners have is that they cannot evaluate their item properly. This is a serious issue since it might affect your profits negatively. That is why you should not hesitate to have your antique furniture professionally appraised and valued. There are a number of steps you need to take in order to get your antique furniture fairly evaluated.

The first thing you have to learn is what determines the value of antique pieces. There are four main factors. The provenance and history of each piece are extremely important. If your piece of antique furniture was made by a prominent carpenter or workshop and/or has a fascinating story, it will certainly be more valuable. This is equally true for the rarity of an item. The rarer it is the more valuable it is. The condition of the piece of furniture will also determine its value. Perhaps the main factor of all is the quality of the item. The design and the craftsmanship used in the making are extremely important.

It is important to thoroughly clean your antique furniture before getting it evaluated. It is important for you to use a cleaning guide, especially if you have not dealt with such a task before. You should use standard methods for cleaning that do not involve the removal or altering of the finish. Refinishing the piece might actually lower its value. Remove any stains with a standard cleaner or lemon juice. You might want to use amalgamator for the water stains. If there are many scratches, pigmented oil stain will help to remove them. Use some wax to give the item some more gloss, but never spray with a silicon based wax.

After you have the antique piece of furniture in perfect condition, you should take pictures of it. It is best to do it in a sunlit part of the house, so that all details can be easily seen. Take pictures of the entire piece from all four sides. You might want to photograph its top, if applicable. Then you have to take pictures of the most notable features of the piece. These include the legs, handles, armrests, pulls and ornamentations. It is important to photograph these details to get more accurate evaluation.


Once you have the pictures, you have to find a reliable appraiser to evaluate your antique piece of furniture. It is a great idea to ask around for a reputable and ethical professional. Antique dealers and collectors might give you a hint. You can also look for any organized events that you can get your item appraised at. These include lectures, seminars and antique furniture shows. Generally, most certified appraisers will not charge you for their services, but some may do so.

One alternative to have your antique furniture item valued for free is to send its pictures to an auction house. Even the biggest names in the industry pay attention to all pieces offered to them. The auction house expert will evaluate your item and give you the information you need. Remember that you are not obliged to have your piece auctioned at this auction house.

Every antique furniture expert will give you a value range. This means that they will not set an actual monetary price. They will give you an estimate of the amount of money you can receive from a deal and of the highest amount of money you can receive from a buyer. Keep in mind that the market price of your antique furniture item will be determined by other factors apart from its value. Overall, it is essential to have your antique furniture piece or pieces evaluated. You do not have to rely on an expert completely. You can use the pictures you have taken to research your item. There are various books on antique furniture that you can use for reference. You should also look into price catalogues, antique shops and online auctions to see the prices of pieces similar to yours.
